## News from our Classrooms

## Report from Ms. Lawlor's Junior/Senior Infant Class

We were learning all about pets in November. During our Aistear playtime the children explored the theme of animals through playing with, plasticine, sand, small toys and construction toys. Our role-play area was transformed into a very busy veterinary surgery. The children played as vets, receptionists and customers. Lots of animals came to visit us in our class and we were delighted to have a turtle donated to us by Petmaster. The children have been taking turns to feed him every morning. The children have also been learning about dinosaurs, and they've been sharing their knowledge about dinosaurs with their teacher too! We've been busy getting our lovely Christmas decorations ready for the Annual Christmas Craft Fair and we look forward to seeing you all there on Sunday!

## Report from Ms. Ormonde's 1<sup>st</sup>/2<sup>nd</sup> Class

1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> class were busy learning about the weather this month. We learned how to be a meteorologist and practised in our role play area in Aistear. We made some weather instruments and we even brought them outside to check how much rain fell, the wind speed, the wind direction and the temperature. We watched a really old weather forecast from a long time ago and we compared this to a weather forecast clip for November this year. We also learned all about the water cycle and we drew a diagram of it.

We were working hard on our Christmas crafts for the craft fair this weekend. We loved making our decorations and we can't wait to show them to our families on Sunday. We have just started decorating our classroom for Christmas and we can't wait for December.

## Report from Ms. Pitt's 3<sup>rd</sup>/4<sup>th</sup> Class

This month we completed the novel 'Matilda' by Roald Dahl. The children seemed to really enjoy the novel and Roald Dahl's style of writing. They had great fun doing the associated drama activities such as role play, role on the wall, freeze frames, student in role and thought tracking. We have been working on the exposition writing genre in English, with the purpose to persuade others involving argument and debate. They have learned about the structure of an exposition piece of writing: State problem/argument, arguments for and supporting evidence (3 points minimum), arguments against and supporting evidence (1 point minimum) and a conclusion. The children enjoy when we begin the lesson with a moving debate to discuss our ideas for or against the title of the exposition piece, it is great for developing ideas and improving upon their oral language skills.

We have been busy with artwork this month as the children have been working on their crafts for the Christmas Craft Fair. They had great fun creating their candle holders and Christmas trees, and are very excited about everyone seeing their artwork in the upcoming craft fair. In history we were learning about the story of the artist Pablo Picasso, they learned about the Cubism style of art that he is well known for and created some interesting portraits inspired by this style of art. We have been focusing on drawing this month; we also created 'Catching Snowflakes' and 'Snowmen' pictures.

3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Class love singing. Well done on a fantastic performance in 'Sing Out Loud' in the Opera House. You were all fantastic; singing and dancing. We were very proud of you all on stage. In class we have been creating some group compositions using body percussion and the percussion instruments to create a winter themed piece. We have also been working on the song 'Over the Rainbow' and practising rhythms. The children have been learning about the values of different notes and recording what they hear being clapped such as crotchets, quavers, minims, dotted minims and crotchet rests.

## Report from Ms. O'Gorman's 4<sup>th</sup>/5<sup>th</sup> Class

During November, we have been working extremely hard. We have worked on Exposition Writing, learning how to persuade other people through the genre. We wrote speeches, to influence our classmates to vote for us to be on the Student Council. We also completed our novel, 'Rosie's Troubles'.

In Maths, we worked on Fractions and Decimals, exploring the relationship between them. Some pupils made an excellent effort over the month at Mangahigh, developing their maths and I.T skills at home.

In Gaeilge, we learned about the topic 'Sa Bhaile', and can now confidently discuss our houses and surroundings as Gaeilge, as well as writing about this topic. We began to learn about the 'Aimsir Láithreach' or present tense, as our grammar topic this month. In History, we looked at the lives of some famous people from the past, namely Bobby Sands and Margaret Thatcher, and compiled reports on each. In Geography, we learned about the mountain ranges of Ireland, and designed brochures for the physical attractions of Co. Wexford. In Science, we learned about conduction, convection and radiation, and the transfer of heat.

4th Class worked so hard practising for 'Sing Out Loud' as part of the music curriculum, and both classes have improved so much at tin whistle. In Art, we have been busy making some beautiful decorations to sell at the Craft Fair, and also created skyscraper art, based on the work of James Rizzi. Our S.P.H.E topics for the month have been quite serious, learning about the effects drugs and smoking can have on people's lives. We have also been working hard in preparation for the Craft Fair, and look forward to showing off our wares on Sunday.

## Report from Mrs. Brophy's 6<sup>th</sup> Class

November has been a busy month in 6<sup>th</sup> Class preparing for the Christmas Craft Fair. We made lots of beautiful decorations to sell and many thanks to Patricia Murphy for all her help and guidance. We hope you will join us on Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> December at our Fair.

In Maths this month we have been learning about fractions and 2D shapes. History saw us learning about Margaret Thatcher, Bobby Sands and John Hume. The children completed wonderful projects in Geography on 'Great Britain and Northern Ireland'. They worked very hard and did fantastic research on our nearest neighbour

We have completed our novel 'When Hitler Stole Pink Rabbit' by Judith Kerr. The children wrote a book report on the novel and gave it a majority score of 4/5. We shall commence our next novel in January.
