Report from Ms. Boggan's 2nd Class

December has been yet another busy month in 2nd class. In English this month we have been doing further work on exposition writing. We have been learning about the structure of an exposition beginning with a title, then stating the argument or problem, listing 3 reasons to justify their opinion and then they finish off with a conclusion. We have been discussing topics and doing exposition writing based on the topics such as: pocket money, eating vegetables and caging animals in the zoo. The children came up with lots of great ideas arguing for or against the titles. The topics we covered provided some great discussion opportunities.

In S.E.S.E we have been learning about Christmas in other countries, it's been very interesting learning about traditions, food and weather in countries such as Australia, Poland and Mexico. The children have also been busy asking older family members about their memories of Christmas long ago; it was lovely to hear what Christmas was like for their grandparents when they were young.

This month has also been full of song, dance and acting as we prepare for our Christmas play 'Christmas with the Aliens'. This involves a story of the aliens landing to a school where the children are practising for their Christmas nativity play; the aliens in turn get to learn all about the story of the first Christmas as taught to them by the children in the nativity play. The children have been fantastic at learning the songs, actions and lines. They are so excited for the play to be recorded so that their family get to see them performing their parts.

Report from Ms. Morrissey's 3rd/4th Class

It's hard to believe that it's time for the December newsletter already!

<u>Christmas performance</u>: This month we have been extremely busy preparing and rehearsing for our Christmas performance which we are all very excited about. The children have been busy working on a variety of dance moves, songs and learning off lines and scripts as well. We are excited to share it with you all very soon.

<u>Literacy</u>: We are coming close to the end of our class novel The Butterfly Lion, and so many great questions, discussions and debates have happened as a result of our reading and probing a little deeper. We are looking forward to finishing it off after the holidays. In our literacy stations, children have been doing lots of Christmas themed writing and they have been very creative and festive! Children have also been researching about Christmas traditions from around the world and compiling some very interesting fact files.

<u>Maths</u>: Kids are always working so hard when it comes to maths and this month has been no different. Division, length and long multiplication have been just a few areas that we have been working on this month.

<u>S.E.S.E</u>: we have been looking at Earth and our place in space this month. We have been learning al labout the Solar System, and made up our rhyme to help us learn the correct order of the planets from the sun. We also looked at how day and night and the seasons come about! Kids have also been researching their own facts about a planet of their choice during literacy stations also.

<u>P.E:</u> Children have been enjoying a mixture of GAA coaching and fundamental movement skills with Murt and last week all participants received certificates as a result of their participation. This is a highlight for many kids each week and we are very grateful for the coaching, games and fun that it brings!

Report from Mrs. Brophy's 5th/6th Class

December has been busy in the senior class as we began practicing our Christmas play 'The Egyptian Nativity'. The children have been working very hard on this piece of work and we hope you will enjoy watching the recording over the Christmas holidays.

In English we finished working on our novel 'Holes' as we focused on the themes of 'bullying' and 'inheritance' amongst the characters. We compared the novel to the movie and identified many similarities and differences. We have also completed our 'Procedural Writing' genre.

In Maths we studied 'number theory' and 'multiplication'. The children also completed their Christmas assessment. In geography we have begun learning about 'climate and weather'. The children have been studying how clouds are formed and the many different types of cloud. They also finished their project on 'Russia' which were very enjoyable to read and of a very high standard.

John is a software engineer and he spent time with us explaining what exactly his job entails and helping us to design our own basic code for a new invention. He was very interesting to listen to.
