Dear Parents/Guardians,

As I reflect on what's been an extraordinary year, I want to pay tribute to all members of our school community. Firstly, to our pupils, who have shown fantastic resilience, and coped so well with all the changes to the school calendar and routine this year. It's been wonderful this month, as we enjoyed our various fun days, to see them all in good form, enjoying school and having fun with friends.

To our staff, I want to extend a huge thank you. All members of staff have gone above and beyond this year to ensure school runs smoothly for our pupils. From making huge changes to the school at the beginning of the year to implement a Covid Response Plan, to adjusting to teaching remotely, ensuring that the children were still receiving a great education when the building was closed, and most importantly, when school is open under restrictions, they have always ensured that the children were burdened as little as possible, by fears around infection, and the restrictions that ensued. We are so lucky to have such a fantastic group working here in Ballymurn.

Finally, to our parents. At times like this, the link between school and home is tested to the full, and I could not be more thankful to work with such a fantastic group of parents. We, as a staff thank you all most sincerely for the efforts you all made during remote learning, to ensure that your children continued to progress as well as possible.

We haven't let Covid restrictions get the better of us in school yet, and have had a really fun June in school, which I would love for you all to read about below.

We have also been doing a number of word and language games to build vocabulary in a fun categories game which needs sharp thinking against the clock! Well done everyone.

In art we have been looking at the use of line to create 3D art. This means that we give the illusion that something has three dimensions and appears to be almost jumping off the page. We did 3D name art, and this took a lot of listening and following instructions before the children could go and add their own personal and creative touches to it. It was certainly a challenge to get the 3D effect, but they all look amazing!

Finally I would like to say a heartfelt thank you to every child, parent and guardian who worked so cooperatively with me this year in a year that was anything but straightforward. It is much appreciated. I want to wish you all a happy, healthy and relaxing Summer break.
