# Homework Survey Summary

We extend our thanks to all parents who participated in our homework survey, which will aid us in our review of our Homework Policy. We received 66 responses overall, and were delighted to note that the majority of parents seem to be very happy with the changes we have made to the homework we assign since we returned to school post-covid. Please see a summary of the results below.

Junior Infants-1st Class: 100% of parents in this category stated that they were happy with the volume and content of homework that their children receive each night.

2nd-6th Class: 100% of parents agreed that their children get enough homework each night. 90% of parents felt that the elimination of written homework improved the amount and quality of time that their children get to spend practising reading and doing learning homework.

77.5% of parents felt that we should continue to use Mangahigh for online maths homework each night. Those who didn't agree with this were asked to explain why, and 8 parents replied to this, with 2 of these stating that they would like a mixture of online and written work, whilst one mentioned internet issues, and two more stated that they prefer written work, whilst one said they prefer less use of apps.

We intend to conduct a pupil homework survey next. and then at our next staff meeting in January, we will begin to put our new Homework Policy together.

# Lámh

We have been making an effort in school to begin learning Lámh, which is the manual sign language system that is used in Ireland by children and adults who have communication needs. There are some children within our school community who use Lámh, so we feel that it is very important for staff and pupils to become familiar with Lámh. It is not just important in school, as in our daily lives we will often encounter people with communication difficulties, and would love to see our pupils able to use Lámh in these situations. RTE player have produced a series called Dizzy Deliveries, which is fantastic tool for learning Lámh and all of our pupils are watching this in class. We'd love to encourage families to watch the series at home too on RTE player, to reinforce the children's learning of Lámh and to give other members of the family the opportunity to learn too.

**Absences** -Leanna has sent a text to all families containing the link for our back to school form, which must be filled in each time your child returns following an absence from school. This link is also available on our website, ballymurnns.ie, under the "Useful Information" tab.

As always, we must remind parents that we are obliged by law to report instances where children have been absent for a cumulative total of twenty days or more during the school year to Tusla.

**Garda Vetting** - It is a legal requirement that any parents who wish to be involved in school activities e.g. Rackard League, Hurling 365 etc., must be Garda vetted through the school. We realise that many parents are already Garda vetted through the G.A.A and other organisations, but unfortunately, everybody still needs to go through the school vetting process. If you would like to become involved and have not been vetted previously, please contact the school office for a form. This also applies if you are giving a lift to another child to matches

**Morning Supervision-** School gates do not open until 9.10am, and no pupils should be on the premises before this. Morning supervision is outdoors, and on wet days, children must wait in the shelter until school opens at 9.20am. Please ensure that adults who are dropping your kids to school take care to not pull in or turn opposite the school gates.

**Healthy Eating** - Reminder that the school operates a 'healthy eating policy'. Children are allowed a small treat each Friday and we thank parents for their support in implementing this policy. This is available on our website 'www.ballymurnns.ie'

**Parking**- Please remember to park with care on the street outside the school. Do not double park or block access to staff cars. The car park spaces provided are for staff use and the school bus <u>only</u>. We also ask that people please do not park directly opposite the school, as our bus for pupils with Special Educational Needs parks there. Please do not park in these spaces when dropping off or collecting your child from school. Please be conscious of how/where you park, taking the children's safety into account at all times.

**Communication** - Parents are reminded that if you have a concern/issue which you would like to raise with the school; you must make an appointment to speak to your child's teacher, through the school office.

**Grievances** - If any parent/guardian has a grievance they would like to raise with the school, please follow the procedures as laid out in our 'Communication Policy'. This policy is available to read on our website 'www.ballymurnns.ie'

In all cases we endeavour to deal with issues raised as promptly and fairly as possible. We will do our best to resolve any and every situation as far as is practicable.
