Homework Survey

Our approach to homework has changed since we returned to school following the pandemic and distance learning, and we have reduced the focus on written work. Our Homework Policy needs to be reviewed to reflect the change that has occurred, and teachers have begun the process of reviewing this. Our first step was to send a survey to parents, which issued on Tuesday. We extend our thanks to those of you who have participated, and ask that anyone else who would like to participate do so before the survey goes offline tomorrow.

Absences -Leanna has sent a text to all families containing the link for our back to school form, which must be filled in each time your child returns following an absence from school. Garda Vetting - It is a legal requirement that any parents who wish to be involved in school activities e.g. Rackard League, Hurling 365 etc., must be Garda vetted through the school. We realise that many parents are already Garda vetted through the G.A.A and other organisations, but unfortunately, everybody still needs to go through the school vetting process. If you would like to become involved and have not been vetted previously, please contact the school office for a form. This also applies if you are giving a lift to another child to matches

Morning Supervision- School gates do not open until 9.10am, and no pupils should be on the premises before this. Morning supervision is outdoors, and on wet days, children must wait in the shelter until school opens at 9.20am. Please ensure that adults who are dropping your kids to school take care to not pull in or turn opposite the school gates. I'd like to thank everyone for their co-operation since my last message on that subject.

Healthy Eating - Reminder that the school operates a 'healthy eating policy'. Children are allowed a small treat each Friday and we thank parents for their support in implementing this policy. This is available on our website 'www.ballymurnns.ie'

Parking- Please remember to park with care on the street outside the school. Do not double park or block access to staff cars. The car park spaces provided are for staff use and the school bus <u>only</u>. We also ask that people please do not park directly opposite the school, as our bus for pupils with

Special Educational Needs parks there. Please do not park in these spaces when dropping off or collecting your child from school. Please be conscious of how/where you park, taking the children's safety into account at all times.

Communication - Parents are reminded that if you have a concern/issue which you would like to raise with the school; you must make an appointment to speak to your child's teacher, through the school office.

Class Reports

Ms. O'Gorman's Junior Infant Report 🙂

I'm happy to report that our Junior Infants continue to flourish and are well settled into their new school at this stage.

Our Aistear themes this month were 'School' and 'Hallowe'en', and the role play corner saw lots of principals, teachers, witches, pumpkins and more in action! Some fabulous Halloween artwork has been produced by the children and there will be some very scary Frankensteins and ghosts going home tomorrow.

The children have been working on the themes of 'Ar Scoil' and 'Oíche Shamhna' in Irish, and have learned lots of new vocabulary and songs which they can be heard using informally in the classroom.. In Maths, we continue with our Ready, Set, Go Maths programme, which involves lots of practical learning. The boys and girls have made amazing progress with their Jolly Phonics and are already reading word lists for homework, which is amazing. We've also commenced work on letter formation, and are still doing lots of cutting and other fine motor activities to make our hands nice and strong.

We have read some beautiful storybooks about Hallowe'en, and been learning to use the comprehension strategy of 'Visualisation' whilst listening to these. We have worked on Road Safety Awareness, and each child got a high- vis jacket from the RSA to take home and wear when out walking or cycling. We are extremely excited to dress up tomorrow and go on our first ever Hallowe'en Hike from Ballymurn N.S.

Ms.Lawlor's Senior Infants and 1st Class Report 🙂

Our Aistear theme for October was Autumn and Halloween. The children enjoyed a nature walk to spot some of the signs of Autumn. We were delighted to have some of the 6th class girls to accompany us on our walk. Our role-play area was transformed into a haunted house for October. The children dressed up, wrote potion recipes and spells for our big book of spells. They also made some very disgusting and terrifying food to eat in the house! In the art area they created many lovely pieces but they particularly enjoyed making pumpkins out of clay.

Last week the class enjoyed lots of fun activities for Maths Week. The children played snakes and ladders, snap and skittles maths. We also had an estimation competition. Everyone had to guess how many pasta shapes were in the bottle. Well done to Cillian who guessed the nearest amount to the answer! During October we also had Climate Action Week. The children listened to a story called "We Want our Park Back".

In history lessons the children were learning about the origins of Halloween and the traditions that have been passed on through the years. We hope to try out some of the traditional games on Friday. We are also learning about how to keep safe at Halloween.

The children have worked so hard since coming back to school. I hope everyone has lots of fun and rest over the mid-term break!

Ms. Boggan's 2nd and 3rd Class Report 🙂

2nd and 3rd class have been doing great work this month. We were delighted to have Ms. Hogan in our class for the last five weeks, she taught the children so many fun lessons and the class learned so many new things from her.

In geography the children have been learning all about settlements. They learned about all of the different types of settlements, about urban and rural areas, and also all about the different materials that are used to form the different types of settlements.

In science the children have been learning about human life processes. There was a focus on how we need food for energy and growth. They learned about the different areas of the food pyramid and what groups the different types of food belong to.

In history the children have been learning about schools in the past. They looked at some old photographs comparing school life in the past with schools in the present day. There was lots of discussion about the resources used, rules, uniforms, the classrooms and advances in technology over the years. The children were also delighted to have Charlie our caretaker in for a visit, where they interviewed him about his experience of going to school in Ballymurn and how it has changed over the years. They have also been learning about Tom Crean, the explorer in history. They learned about his expeditions and achievements, and created a timeline of the main events of his story.

In P.E this month we have been focusing on games. They have had great fun playing playground games such as chain tag and the numbers game. They have been practising their dribbling, throwing and catching skills in different drills and activities. They also had a cricket session with the visiting coaches, they had so much fun practising catching, throwing, bowling and batting. They were delighted when they got to play a mini game of cricket too. They loved learning to play a new sport.

October has once again been a very busy month in our classroom. We have been working very hard, completing our first history project, finishing our novel and learning new topics in maths. We also had a visit from the Dental Nurse to teach us how to look after our teeth.

In Geography we are learning about Germany and will begin our project on this country in November. Finally, we are still busy practicing for our 'Sing Out Loud' event which shall take place in November. That will be such a fun night for all of us.

Ms. Morrissey's 5th/6th Class Report ☺

The month of October has gone spookily fast! Things are busier than ever in the 5th and 6th class classroom! In English we have been looking at the idea of different perspectives and how books, fairytales, movies always portray a hero in a certain way, and villains in a certain way. We took the well known story the 3 Little Pigs and decided that it was time to create a switch on these perspectives. The 3 not so innocent pigs had been up to no good, framing the hungry and lonely wolf! Maths has been very busy between our new topics of fractions, lines and angles, data and participating in many many tasks and challenges as part of Maths Week! We have had lots of fun working in groups on our weekly challenges and word problems, keep it up everyone!

Art saw us finally finish pur selfie self portraits which had taken us a number of weeks to complete! We also created a very eye catching display for Halloween using Dia de Las Muertos or Day of The Dead as our inspiration. We used acrylic paint for the skulls and pastelles to pop some colour on giving these skeletons a little bit of attitude and personality! Well done, they look amazing!

We had some very exciting days for P.E which saw us taking on a new game and skills through cricket! It was great seeing the kids all learn so much about a new sport that they knew very little about.
