Report from Ms. O'Reilly's Junior Infant Class

For our School Tour, we visited Woodfield House and got to do loads of hands-on activities. The boys and girls got to milk pretend cows, build turf towers, paint, make butter, play bodhráns and had a wet sponge fight. We had so much fun there!

Active Week was so exciting. We started the week off with Splash Day. Everyone joined in and love every minute of it! On Thursday, we had our first Sports Day. The children did so well and really enjoyed taking part in the races such as the running race, three-legged race and skipping race. We got to taste some delicious burgers after to finish off the day.

Report from Ms. Lawlor's Senior Infants and 1^{st} Class

The last two months have just flown by in our classroom. The children have been busy finishing their schoolwork for the year in between all the fun days we had to fit in! 1st Class have been perfecting their joined writing, with a focus on the capital letters over the past few weeks. In Maths they have also been working very hard on addition with renaming and subtraction. Senior Infants have also been working hard on sentence writing, reading and adding 3 numbers in Maths.

Our Aistear play themes were based on summer themes, The Airport in May and The Beach in June. We have learned about how to stay safe on the beach. In History we read a Polish story called The Dragon of Krakow and the children made their own dragon using junk art materials.

Our school tour to Woodfield House was great fun. The children participated in many traditional games and fun activities such as bubble making, painting, limbo dancing and bodhrán playing. The children's behaviour was fantastic during all our fun days. Splash day was also a great day for everyone.

As the school year ends, I just want to say that I have really enjoyed being your child's teacher this year. They have been such a fun and enthusiastic group to work with every day. Have a lovely sunny and safe summer everyone.

Report from Ms. Boggan's 2nd & 3rd Class This has been another busy month in 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} class.

In Gaeilge we have been learning all about 'Caitheamh Aimsire'- hobbies. The children learned how to say different phrases about the topic. They also have been learning a song called 'Ceol' and a poem called 'Iascaireacht'. In English we have been learning about procedural writing-where we have been writing collective pieces together as a class and reading comprehensions based on that genre. We are just finishing up another novel 'Charlotte's Web' by E. B White. The children have really enjoyed the story and love how it's based on animals. They are looking forward to watching the movie when we have the book completed. In maths we have been doing lots of revision work on topics such as data, fractions, addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. They have been working on problem solving to revise each of the topics too.

We had a fantastic time on the school tour earlier this month in Pirate's Cove- the children enjoyed GellyBall shooting, Fun Caves, Bubble Rollers, Go Karts, Bumper Boats, Adventure Golf and Bowling. It was an action-packed day from start to finish. The children loved spending time with their friends and trying out all of the different activities that day.

The class had a great time during Active Week this month. We began each day with a 5 minute workout from Joe Wicks. We did a 10 minute 'Run Around Ireland' each day and recorded our total number of laps each day where we managed to collectively run to lots of different landmarks around the country. We also got to play crab soccer on the field which was led by the 6^{th} class pupils. The children also got to watch the 6^{th} class vs staff rounders match on one of the afternoons. Splash Day was another fun day of activities where the children moved around the various water stations to complete the water games with their class. Active Week also included Sports Day where the children took part in lots of different races with their teammates from the other classes.

We had a most enjoyable end to the school year with lots of fun activities. I wish all of the children and their families a safe and fun-filled summer break.
