### Garda Vetting

It is a legal requirement that any parents who wish to be involved in school activities e.g. Rackard League, Hurling 365 etc., must be Garda vetted through the school. #### Morning Supervision

School gates do not open until 9.10am, and no pupils should be on the premises before this. Morning supervision is outdoors, and on wet days, children must wait in the shelter until school opens at 9.20am. Please ensure that adults who are dropping your kids to school take care to not pull in or turn opposite the school gates.

## Healthy Eating

Reminder that the school operates a 'healthy eating policy'. Children are allowed a small treat each Friday and we thank parents for their support in implementing this policy. This is available on our website 'www.ballymurnns.ie'

## Parking

Please remember to park with care on the street outside the school. Do not double park or block access to staff cars. The car park spaces provided are for staff use and the school bus only. We also

ask that people please do not park directly opposite the school, as our bus for pupils with 4 Special Educational Needs parks there. Please do not park in these spaces when dropping off or collecting your child from school. Please be conscious of how/where you park, taking the children's safety into account at all times. We would appreciate if you could convey this information to grandparents and childminders that drop off and collect pupils.

Parents are reminded that if you have a concern/issue which you would like to raise with the school; you must make an appointment to speak to your child's teacher, through the school office.

## Class Reports

#### Ms. Ormonde's Junior & Senior Infants

Junior and senior infants have got off to a flying start this term. Our nine new junior infants and two new senior infants have settled into their new school with ease and their fellow senior infants have been role models from day one. Well done everyone!

We began the year by focusing on the themes 'my home' and 'my family.' The children practised their fine motor and cutting skills through a variety of activities such as playdough, peg boards, links and tweezers. The children have been enjoying engaging in playful learning through the 'Aistear' approach and within their groups have been exploring activities such as junk art, role play, small world and construction. The children have been enjoying station teaching where we practise reading, writing and learning new sounds in our small groups.

This month our focus turned to 'school,' 'autumn' and now 'Halloween.' The children enjoyed a fabulous nature walk where we collected all sorts of signs of autumn. We made leaf hedgehogs, carved pumpkins and pretended to make potions.

Well done junior and senior infants, have a lovely Halloween break!:)

#### Ms Lawlor's Senior Infants & 1st Class

It's been a very busy 9 weeks in our classroom and we've had lots of fun getting to know each other whilst we learn! The time has gone so fast and we're really looking forward to dressing up on Friday and going on our Halloween hike.

Our Aistear themes were myself and my family, Autumn and Halloween. Our role-play area has been both a family home and a haunted house. The children enjoyed going in to role as a family member or Halloween character. They've been writing spells and cooking up potions in the cauldron.

In English, both classes have been working hard at revising letter formations correctly and 1<sup>st</sup> class have been learning to use cursive writing for the first time. We are learning how to use the language of recount in both our writing and during Aistear playtimes.

We especially enjoyed Wellbeing Week and Maths Week when the children got a chance to do lots of fun activities. They particularly enjoyed creating a Gratitude Tree and the estimating competition and games during Maths Week.

## Ms Boggan's 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> Class

In English we have been learning about the genre of recount writing. We have been reading different samples of this form of writing about topics such as 'Josh's Summer Holidays', 'Molly's Birthday Wish' and 'Our Nature Walk'. The children learned how to structure their own recounts after practising writing recounts as modelled by the teacher, together with the class and in pairs. They followed the structure of beginning with the orientation, then the sequence of events and finally ending with a reflection. We have been reading the novel 'Matilda' by Roald Dahl. The children have been enjoying the storyline and getting to know all of the characters so far. They look forward to doing more drama and written activities based upon it in the coming weeks.

In maths the children have been working hard this month. 3<sup>rd</sup> class have recently begun learning their multiplication tables, it is important to practise learning them every night for homework. There are lots of fun games and tasks on Mangahigh to practise tables on also. We recently had Maths Week in school, the children loved engaging with some fun activities that week in maths. They did a great job working out simultaneous equations where they had to figure out what numbers the pictures represented to work out the answers. The children also enjoyed playing a 2D shapes memory game where they had to find the matching pairs. The class got to do an online mini maths quiz on Thursday too which they really enjoyed. The children had great fun one of the days in their pairs playing a 'three-in-a-row' subtraction game using dice. We worked on the topic of data that week in maths where the children learned how to use a tally, and how to create and interpret pictograms and bar charts. They picked different topics to survey the class on and created pictograms/bar charts to show their results.

In SESE the children have been learning about their home county of Wexford. They learned about it's location in Ireland, the towns, neighbouring villages, bordering counties, longest river, highest mountain, landmarks and much more. They worked on group posters about our wonderful county to show some of the information they have been learning about their county. In history the class have been recently learning about one of the landmarks in Wexford which is Enniscorthy Castle. They learned about how the castle has changed over the years and some of it's inhabitants over the years. The children created a class timeline of the castle through the years.

#### Ms Kehoe's 4th & 5th Class

4th and 5th class settled back well. September was a busy month preparing ourselves for the new year ahead. The children were very occupied with various topics and activities. 5th class have began some preparations for their confirmation also. Fr. Finn has visited us on a few occasions to discuss the sacrament too.

We got involved with doing a little art for the end for the Harvest Mass which took place in Ballymurn Church on Saturday. We made autumnal wreaths which were beautifully displayed in the church. Some of the confirmation class participated in the mass, bringing up gifts to the altar.

4th and 5th class were very busy for over two weeks at the start of October completing projects in groups on a local study. 4th class had the opportunity to explore the history of Enniscorthy Castle. 5th class researched the history of Vinegar Hill. The children had a very positive approach to these two topics which are huge parts of our local history. It was a good opportunity to practice group work and share the workload. All projects were presented to the class.

The children have written descriptive recounts over the last few weeks as well as exploring some poetry. One poem we looked at was 'The Copper Fox' by Mary Anderson. We then based our art on the poem. The children drew foxes curled up. They painted them snuggled up in the grass.

We were also busy with Well-being activities. We practiced mindfulness activities and incorporated lovely art into lessons. The pupils made a tree of gratitude and recorded many things they feel grateful for on leaves that hang from the tree on our class door. The following engaged in maths weeks. We participated in games and problem solving activities.

Overall it's been an active term. I hope everyone has a lovely fun and restful break.

## Ms Sheehan's 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> Class

5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> Class have had a great start to this new school year. The kids have been settling in, getting to know each other and are working really well. In English we have been learning all about recount writing and they are writing some great stories as well as learning some nice poems. In Gaeilge we have been focussing on developing our oral skills and have been talking about ourselves, homes, school and Oiche Shamhna. The children are making good progress. We have learned about food, hygiene, healthy eating and health and safety in the kitchen. We have explored the story of Anne Frank and life in WW2. Some of the boys and girls in 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> Class have been taking part in Rackard League and Mini Sevens matches so we decided to research the opposition and all the villiages around County Wexford. We had the pleasure of having Kelly Anne Dempsey with us for four weeks. She led some lovely lessons with the children and they enjoyed that.

We have enjoyed Well Being week, Walk to School Week and most recently Maths week. The children are busy with the Green School Programme and representing their peers on the Student Council. We

also attended an online Digital Safety Webinar where the children learned how to protect themselves while using social media and/or online games. We are all looking forward to a well deserved break for Halloween and will hopefully return fresh and ready for another busy half-term!

The Crescent Class had a very busy start to their new school term. We welcomed all our friends back in September and got straight to work with our 'back to school' theme. We learned all about the people that worked in our school and painted our school bags and practised our cutting and sticking, putting all of our items on display in our hallway. So far, we have made delicious pizza, cupcakes, krispie pumpkin buns and chocolate decorated apples and we have lots more ideas in store which we are looking forward to. We enjoyed learning all about wellbeing and we took part in wellbeing week. We particularly enjoyed our 'waka waka dance' and loved taking part in our whole school wellbeing walk. We love our guided meditation time in the Crescent room it helps us all to relax and chill out.

We painted our Autumn trees and for maths week we made apple finger print number lines and guessed the sweets in the bottle.
