Hot School Lunches

A reminder that hot school lunches will be given to all pupils daily from Monday, April 8th. A reminder to all parents to ensure to login and order your children's lunches. Log in details went home with the pupils last week, if they get miss laid you must contact Fresh Today directly to retrieve them. Pupils will be issued with lunchboxes by Fresh Today, which will be used to take home their empty cartons and leftovers each day. This lunchbox must be clean and back in their school bag each day.

Because children will be getting a full dinner at lunchtime, a quick snack should now suffice for small break and please ensure they bring plenty to drink each day.

Absences -Leanna has sent a text to all families containing the link for our back to school form, which must be filled in each time your child returns following an absence from school. Enrolment

Our enrolment process for September 2024 has now concluded but we are still taking enrolments for our mainstream classes.

Garda Vetting - It is a legal requirement that any parents who wish to be involved in school activities e.g. Rackard League, Hurling 365 etc., must be Garda vetted through the school. Rackard League games will commence in March, so it is especially important that parents of this age group ensure that their vetting is up to date. We realise that many parents are already Garda vetted through the G.A.A and other organisations, but unfortunately, everybody still needs to go through the school vetting process. If you would like to become involved and have not been vetted previously, please contact the school office for a form. This also applies if you are giving a lift to another child to matches.

Morning Supervision— School gates do not open until 9.10am, and no pupils should be on the premises before this. Morning supervision is outdoors, and on wet days, children must wait in the shelter until school opens at 9.20am.

Healthy Eating - Reminder, that the school operates a 'healthy eating policy'. Children are allowed a small treat each Friday and we thank parents for their support in implementing this policy. This is available on our website 'www.ballymurnns.ie'

Parking- Please remember to park with care on the street outside the school. Do not double park or block access to staff cars. The car park spaces provided are for staff use and the school bus <u>only</u>. We also ask that people please do not park directly opposite the school, as our bus for pupils with Special Educational Needs parks there. Please do not park in these spaces when dropping off or collecting your child from school. Please be conscious of how/where you park, taking the children's safety into account at all times.

Communication - Parents are reminded that if you have a concern/issue which you would like to raise with the school; you must make an appointment to speak to your child's teacher, through the school office.
